OUR VISION

The vision of Gwinnett Hall Bible College is mission minded and evangelistic in purpose. Therefore, Gwinnett Hall Bible College provides biblical training that is practical, applicable, and attainable for our students.

OUR MISSION

Our mission is to equip pastors, evangelists, music leaders, missionaries, and lay persons for the Lord's service and to enable them to be more effective in the ministry of the local church. DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

STATEMENT OF STANDARDS

Gwinnett Hall Baptist Bible College is an Equal Opportunity higher education institution open to any qualified individual without regard to race, religion, sex, age, color, national or ethnic origin, or disability. The use of alcoholic beverages, tobacco, and illegal narcotics is not permitted.

As a result of our Biblical Baptist beliefs, we reserve the right to offer Pastoral classes that include all courses that pertain to preaching, teaching, pastoral counseling and all others that are gender specific, to men only.

All students must recognize and abide by all of the doctrines and practices of the college.

Gwinnett Hall Baptist College is operated by the parent organization known as Gwinnett Hall Baptist Church and the College is registered as a non-profit religious organization according to the laws of the State of Georgia. GENERAL ACADEMIC INFORMATION

This catalog is to give the prospective student a good picture of the programs offered through the Institute, College, and Graduate divisions of Gwinnett Hall Baptist College. The emphasis is placed on the On-Campus programs as the student will receive much more from their classroom studies being under an instructor. However, there is provision made for those who would like to do Off-Campus programs of study through Correspondence Courses.

The provisions of this catalogue are not to be regarded as an irrevocable contract. The Administration reserves the right to modify, revoke or add to the regulations of the institution at any time.

Should the student drop out of a program of study and later return, he or she is under the catalogue and regulations in effect at the time of return.

Gwinnett Hall does not discriminate on the basis of gender, race, color, national, and ethnic origin in administration of its educational policies or admission of students.

OUR CLASSES

Our classes at Gwinnett Hall Baptist College are taught by professors that have proven themselves faithful in their service to God and to His discipline of study in their lives. Our classroom is considered a laboratory of experience and knowledge for our students to grow, to learn, and to understand God's calling for their lives.

Our professors teach and preach from the King James Version of the Holy Bible. Whenever possible we use text books that adhere to the King James translation.

However, we cannot be held responsible or in agreement with every view point offered by the author. For class uniformity, we ask that every student use the King James Version of the Bible.

ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

Gwinnett Hall Bible College seeks to draw its students from among those who give evidence of a real-life dedication for the Lord's service and who display an earnest desire to prepare themselves for such service.

Prospective students must be willing to lay aside all entanglements and relationships that would hinder diligent perseverance in class work and personal preparation.

Persons desiring to enroll in either the Institute or College must make application to the Office of the Registrar. Applicant must complete the application and submit it along with the proper fees and reference forms. Admission to any particular program will be granted only after an application to that program has been received and approved.

High school education or its equivalent is normally required for entrance, however, anyone lacking such preparation may be considered for enrollment at the option of the Admissions Department provided circumstances, general conditions, ability of the student and space availability combine in making such acceptance possible.

Applicants desiring entrance into the Bachelor's degree program must have completed the requirements for a high school diploma. Successful completion of the GED is also acceptable.

SCHEDULE OF CLASS HOURS

Due to financial pressures and family responsibilities in today's time, it makes it difficult, if not impossible, for some to obtain the needed biblical training. Gwinnett Hall Baptist College is designed to help the person with these problems by arranging the schedule to permit a 40-hour work week.

As a result, class hours are schedule two evenings a week. On Monday, and Thursday evenings classes begin at 6:00 P.M. and end at 9:30 P.M This period of time is divided into an hour and fifteen minute class and a two hours and thirty minute class. As needed classes may be offered on Wednesday mornings from 9:00 A.M. to 12:00 P.M. and Saturday mornings from 8:00 A.M. to 11:00 A.M.

The student is required to attend all classroom lectures, take notes and pass the final exam as given by the professor. Outside assignments may be given to the student to reinforce classroom studies.

ATTENDANCE

As for class absences, under no condition can the student miss more than five (5) classes and receive credit for the course. In cases of absences, the student should notify the professor of the class.

Three (3) tardies constitute one (1) absence. A tardy is considered to be ten (10) minutes or more after the class starts.

Three (3) early leaves constitute one (1) absence. An early leave is considered to be ten (10) minutes or more before class dismissal.

In instances of more than three absences the class professor will assign extra work.

Students are expected to be in class promptly when the buzzer sounds.

The classroom provides the student with the opportunity to sit at the feet of well-trained, learned, and seasoned men of God who have had experience in the ministry and a knowledge of the Scriptures. The student is not exposed to doubts concerning the Bible. However, they are taught that God has preserved His Word and that His Word should be preached to all men of all nations for the salvation of souls.

The student body is of such nature that individual attention is given to each student and each student can feel that he or she is a part of the college family. The opportunities of attending the classroom at Gwinnett Hall Baptist College's Lawrenceville campus is worth the move whereby one may become a part of the resident student body.

COMPLETING A COURSE

Resident students will complete course assignments as may be given by the professors. All outside and/or extra work should be turned in on time and all students should be present for the final exams. Failure on the part of the resident student to abide by these instructions could result in failure of the course being taken.

WITHDRAWAL PROCEDURE

Should a student find it necessary to withdraw from a course of study, he should contact the office immediately. Merely ceasing to submit lesson assignments or attend class does not constitute a withdrawal. Neither does it relieve a student of his financial obligations to the school, providing the student is making monthly payments on his

tuition. When an applicant signs an application, he is signing a contract with the school

If a student decides to withdraw from the College or Seminary, he must do so within 15 days after enrollment should he desire a refund of his tuition. Should the withdrawal be made within 15 days of submitting the application, all tuition will be returned less enrollment fees. If a student withdraws without the consent of the President or Administrator, he receives no refund.

PREPARING LESSONS AND THESIS

Gwinnett Ball Bible College requests of all resident students that present all lesson materials to their Professor, prepared and written on 8 1/2 x 11 inch paper, written only on one side. The school prefers that all lessons be typewritten; however, it is not required. All work should be neat and readable.

All work submitted to the school by Off-Campus students should contain the student's name and ID#, course title, course number and if mailed in their address. The student is asked to make a copy of all his work incase the work is lost in mailing (if mailed). When answering a question on the study guide or from the test, the student should include the question on his own paper and right under each question, write the answer. Each page should be numbered.

When preparing to write a Thesis, the student must have his subject approved before beginning. The student must type general theme of Thesis before meeting with the dean for approval and be able to defend the idea of the Thesis.

When preparing a thesis or research paper, all margins should be as follows: 1 1/2 inch at the bottom and right side. At the beginning of each chapter division of a thesis, the student should allow 1/3 of a page margin at the top. All pages should be numbered at the top right hand corner,

except for the first page of each chapter. Then the number should be center at the bottom. The student should check his spelling and observe the rules of good English grammar.

The student must turn in his work as soon as completed.

GRADING AND CREDITS

Grading in the College, based upon classroom quizzes and participation, examinations, reports and term papers, is on a numerical basis with 70 points required for a passing grade. Letter grades are used in the final analysis, as follows:

All academic work is graded according to the above standard and is evaluated by a faculty member and assigned a letter grade; turned in to the office for file for that student.

TRANSFER CREDITS

Credit will be allowed for work done in other schools where such studies parallel subjects offered at Gwinnett Hall Baptist College, providing the student has received grades of "C" or higher. A transcript of previous work is required before credit can be given. Applicants seeking credit for work done in other schools shall provide the Admissions Office with a description of content of the

studies taken either through the school catalogue or through the notes used in such study. A minimum of 30 semester hours must be completed at Gwinnett Hall Baptist College for undergraduate degrees. A maximum of 9 semester hours credit may be transferred for Master's programs. No transfer credits are allowable on the Doctoral level. The school reserves the right to determine the acceptability of transfer credits.

ADVANCED STANDING - TRANSFER CREDITS

An applicant may be given advance standing through credit transfer from another recognized college or seminary. Such advance standing shall in no instance preclude a minimum of 30 semester hours credit of study with Gwinnett Hall Baptist College.

CREDIT FOR LIFE EXPERIENCE

Gwinnett Hall Bible College will gladly make an assessment on your behalf for credit toward an **undergraduate** degree based upon your Ordained ministry experience. (ie...Missionary, Pastor, Youth Pastor, Associate Pastor). Hours will be based on assessment of the Dean after interview has been conducted, with a fee of \$10 per credit hour. You must make application for such evaluation. A maximum of 25% of an undergraduate degree will be given to the approved student. No life experience credit is given for graduate degrees.

COMMENCEMENT

Degrees and diplomas are awarded to On-Campus and Off-Campus graduates at the annual commencement program upon the successful completion of all requirements for the degree. This includes Dissertations and Thesis.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION

Gwinnett Hall Baptist College's tuition is kept at an absolute minimum in an effort to put a Bible education in reach of any serious minded student. Moreover, one can be assured that he is obtaining any accreditable program of study with Gwinnett Hall Baptist College.

METHODS OF PAYMENT

We accept cash, check, or card.

HANDLING OF ACCOUNT

Prior to registering for a semester, students are responsible for paying all debts from the previous semester. An outstanding balance will prevent the student from registering for the next semester. The College suggests that all fees and tuition be paid in full at the time of enrollment; however, if installments are desired a plan is available. A late charge of \$10 will be added to the account with each late payment.

There will be a \$25 charge for each returned check.

REFUNDS

Withdrawals within 15 days of enrollment will be given a total refund of tuition minus the \$40 registration fee. After 15 days, students are required to remit full payment for classes.

CURRICULUM SUMMARY

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

The program at Gwinnett Hall Baptist College is divided among three schools—Institute, Bible College and Graduate School. In each area students major in Bible. The emphasis of the school provides church related vocations—pastors, youth workers, missionaries, church ministries, etc.

INSTITUTE

Graduate of Theology (Th.G.)

The Institute program is designed for those called into the Lord’s service later in life, who lack the academic background for college level work. The work leading to the Graduate of Theology diploma (Th.G.) will provide the student with a general background in bible. The program required the completion of 99 semester hours credit. Specific course selection will be made to best enable the student to meet his personal goals and objectives. A minimum of 20 hours in bible is required. Students planning to work toward a degree at some future time should work in the Associate’s program as listed in

this catalog.

BIBLE COLLEGE

UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMS

Associate in Biblical Education (A.B.E.)

This is a **two-year program** of college level courses to train laymen to minister in their local churches. Below is a list of suggested courses for the program. Limited substitution may be made with the approval of the school and for valid reasons. Students must complete courses with at least a 2.0 GPA to earn this degree.

GRADUATE PROGRAMS

THE STUDY OF BIBLICAL EDUCATION

Master in Biblical Education (M.B.E.)

The prerequisite for this program is a B.B.E. or acceptable Bible related courses from an acceptable institution. The student must demonstrate ability to perform on a graduate level. The program is designed to provide opportunity for in-depth study for pastors, missionaries and Christian workers. The following schedule is suggested. Substitution may be made with the approval of the school if warranted by the individual's background and vocational interests. The school reserves the right to determine suitable substitution. The program requires completion of **33 hours** of subjects not taken before plus **a dissertation of 30,000 words.** Students must complete courses with at least a 3.0 GPA to earn this

degree.

Doctor in Biblical Education (D.B.E.)

Prerequisite for this program is a M.B.E. The program of study will be tailored to meet the needs and objectives of the individual student taking into consideration his previous course work and future vocational plans. It consists of **45 semester hours; 36 hours** of subject matter courses not taken before plus a **50,000 word dissertation** carrying 9 semester hours credit. Students must complete courses with at least a 3.5 GPA to earn this degree.

The dissertation topic must be approved by the school and must exhibit the quality of work expected of students at the doctoral level. An **oral examination** must be taken before a Committee selected by the Curriculum authorities.

THE STUDY OF THEOLOGY

Bachelor of Theology (Th.B)

This program is designed primarily for pastors, missionaries or Bible teachers. **The prerequisite for this program is a B.B.E.** and requires **18 additional hours** providing more in-depth study of the Scriptures. The 18

hours must be selected from the following courses:

A minimum of three (3) hours in Greek is required. In addition to the **18 hours of subject matter courses, plus a 20,000 word thesis** on a faculty-approved subject is required. Students must complete courses with at least a 3.0 GPA to earn this degree.

Master of Theology (Th.M)

The prerequisite for the program is a Th.B. The Th.M. is designed primarily for pastors and Bible teachers on a college level. It is a **42 hours** program of subjects not taken before. A **30,000 word thesis** on an appropriate subject is required in addition to the subject matter courses. The following schedule of subjects is suggested. Substitutes may be made only upon approval of the school. Students must complete courses with at least a 3.0 GPA to earn this degree.

Doctor of Theology (Th.D)

Prerequisite for this program is a Th.M. A minimum

of 192 hours of undergraduate and graduate credits will be required before work can be begun for the Th.D. It consists of **45 semester hours**; **36 hours** of subject matter courses of subjects not taken before plus a **dissertation of 50,000 words** carrying 9 hours credit. An **oral examination** must be taken before a Committee selected by the Curriculum authorities. Students must complete courses with at least a 3.5 GPA to earn this degree.

CORRESPONDENCE COURSES

Gwinnett Hall Bible College offers correspondence classes to students who cannot attend classes on campus, or who are looking to work further along in their degree. All students are required to read the textbook and answer the questions, typing out their final work and turning in their work at our main campus to be graded by the Dean of Students.

Applicants who desire to enroll under the Correspondence Program may do so during the year. All applicants will be individually evaluated. Persons enrolling are required to give testimony of having accepted the Lord Jesus Christ as their Savior. Transcript of all previous high school, college and seminary work must be sent to the Office for Records.

The correspondence course runs for 16 weeks and can be started and finished anytime in the year, it does not have to coincide with the current semester. The course starts when the student picks up their work at our main campus. A student may finish before 16 weeks, but may not exceed 16 weeks per course. All final work on the course must be mailed or brought to the main campus for grading. All postage is the responsibility of the student.

Should a student find it necessary to withdraw from a course of study, he should contact the office immediately. Merely ceasing to submit lesson assignments does not constitute a withdrawal. If a student withdraws without the consent of the President or Administrator, he receives no refund.
